She was left in her home to deal with her grief, the grief of her parents, the sudden lack of two incomes, and the responsibility to help translate through court proceedings as well as day to day dealings for her parents. She found her home to be a difficult reminder of what she had lost and knew that her brothers had always wanted her to make the best of her education. pulled all of the internal strength she had and began to attend school and prepare to meet her goal of attending STHS for her senior year. She was many credits behind but found the motivation to move towards that goal. That June her best girlfriend graduated and this helped to push her even more.

In the Fall of her senior year signed up for her first college class at Lake Tahoe Community College in order to earn lost credits faster. She successfully passed the class and met her goal of attending South Tahoe High School for her last term of her senior year, for her brothers. She completed another course winter quarter and is weeks away from graduating from high school. strength and determination have continued to make her a HERO in my eyes. She has overcome many personal obstacles and old habits to re-define herself. I am positive this young lady will contribute to our community as she continues to grow and educate herself. She hopes to study cosmetology after high school.
